## Narrative

On June 25, 2026, at approximately 1013 hours, I was dispatched to assist CR31 at 800 E. Derenne Avenue regarding the service of an active warrant.

Upon arrival, I made contact with Community Service Specialist Thomas, who advised that one of the drivers involved in her motor vehicle collision investigation had an active warrant through the Chatham County Sheriff's Office.

I obtained the identifying information of the driver, later identified as Yolandra Ralene Ship (DOB: [REDACTED]/1964), and conducted a GCIC/NCIC inquiry. The inquiry confirmed an active warrant for Ms. Ship.

The warrant information was as follows:

## Narrative

I approached Ms. Ship at the driver's side of her vehicle and advised her that an active warrant had been located. I requested her driver's license and informed her that I would have the warrant reconfirmed through communications records channel. I explained that if the warrant remained valid, she would be placed under arrest and transported to the Chatham County Detention Center.

Ms. Ship stated, "You ain't here to take me to jail. They've looked it up 50 times and they can never find it." She further stated she had been attempting to resolve the matter for approximately four years. Ms. Ship also stated she believed the warrant originated from North Carolina. I advised her that the warrant I had located was issued in the State of Georgia.

I contacted records over the radio and requested confirmation of the warrant. Records confirmed that the warrant was valid.

While I was conducting the warrant investigation, a Chatham County Sheriff's Office deputy, later identified as Deputy Stobert, was on scene. Deputy Stobert remained near Ms. Ship's vehicle and spoke with her while I continued the warrant confirmation process.

I was contacted by Lt. Suddeth via radio and subsequently by telephone. Lt. Suddeth advised that Major Young wanted to know the nature of the incident. I informed Lt. Suddeth that I was conducting a warrant service stemming from a motor vehicle collision investigation and that I was awaiting final confirmation of the warrant. I also advised her of the warrant information.

After receiving confirmation that the warrant was valid, I returned to Ms. Ship's vehicle and advised her that she would need to accompany me to the Chatham County Detention Center. I opened the driver's door to assist her in exiting the vehicle. Ms. Ship asked what the warrant was for, and I advised her it was for Failure to Appear related to the original charges of No Proof of Insurance and Driving Without a Valid Driver's License.

Officer Gordon advised Ms. Ship that she had been cooperative and requested that she continue cooperating by exiting the vehicle so the arrest process could begin.

At that time, Deputy Stobert was positioned near the passenger side of the vehicle and stated, "Hold on just a second. First of all, she's an amputee. You're not going to do anything erratic." Deputy Stobert then walked to the driver's side of the vehicle. I advised Deputy Stobert that we were allowing Ms. Ship sufficient time to gather herself and that we would assist her as needed due to her physical condition. Ms. Ship exited the vehicle voluntarily without incident.

I later received another telephone call from Lt. Suddeth, who asked for the identity of the deputy on scene. I advised her that the deputy identified herself as Deputy Stobert.

As Ms. Ship gathered her personal belongings, she handed me her purse. Deputy Stobert requested the purse. Prior to releasing Ms. Ship's personal property, I asked Ms. Ship if she wanted me to give the purse to Deputy Stobert. After Ms. Ship acknowledged that she did, I relinquished the purse to Deputy Stobert.

During the encounter, Ms. Ship identified Deputy Stobert as her daughter.

Ms. Ship advised that her prosthetic leg was not fully secured because she did not have the harness with her. I asked whether she wished to take additional time to adjust the prosthetic before walking to my patrol vehicle. She declined, stating she preferred not to because of personal privacy concerns. As well as not having the harness for it.

Before placing Ms. Ship into the patrol vehicle, we advised her that several pieces of jewelry could interfere with the placement of handcuffs. I assisted her in removing the jewelry, and she secured those items inside her vehicle.

Throughout the encounter, I repeatedly asked Ms. Ship if she required assistance walking to my patrol vehicle. I advised her that I would assist her in any manner necessary. Ms. Ship walked to my patrol vehicle under her own power with assistance available if needed.

Once seated inside the rear passenger compartment of my marked patrol vehicle, Ms. Ship removed her prosthetic leg for comfort. I placed the prosthetic leg on the opposite side of the rear seat. I then secured Ms. Ship

in hand restraints using the first locking position and double locked the handcuffs to prevent further tightening.

Ms. Ship relinquished control of her vehicle to Deputy Stobert.

I notified dispatch that I had one Black female under arrest and advised that I would be en route to the Chatham County Detention Center. Shortly thereafter, Sgt. Sammuel radioed and instructed me to stand by because he was responding to the scene.

Sgt. Sammuel arrived and advised that Major Young was also responding. Shortly thereafter, Major Roy Minter of the Chatham County Sheriff's Office arrived and spoke directly with Ms. Ship while she remained seated in my patrol vehicle. Major Minter advised Ms. Ship that Major Young had contacted him regarding the incident. Major Minter explained that if the warrant remained active, she would have to answer for the Failure to Appear charge.

Ms. Ship advised that she did not have money to post bond and asked whether she would be released on her own recognizance. She also requested that Major Minter contact Sheriff Coleman.

I provided Major Minter with the warrant information. Major Young and Assistant Chief Gavin also arrived on scene and spoke with Ms. Ship regarding the warrant.

Throughout the encounter, Ms. Ship continued to state that she believed the warrant originated from North Carolina. I again advised her that the warrant had been confirmed through Georgia records.

Assistant Chief Gavin advised that Ms. Ship would be transferred from my patrol vehicle into an unmarked vehicle for her comfort while additional efforts were made to resolve the warrant. I retrieved Ms. Ship's prosthetic leg, and Major Young removed the hand restraints. Ms. Ship was then transferred into a vehicle occupied by Major Young and Lt. Khaalis.

Assistant Chief Gavin instructed me to continue following standard arrest procedures while following Major Young to CCDC. He advised that additional information regarding the warrant was being obtained and that a resolution might be reached before arrival.

Major Minter contacted State Court Records regarding the warrant. State Court Records advised that Ms. Ship could be released provided she report directly to State Court Records, pay the \$75 re-docketing fee, and receive a new court date. Upon completion of that process, the warrant would be canceled.

I volunteered to transport Ms. Ship to the courthouse; however, Lt. Khaalis advised that her and Maj Young would be transporting her to the court house. Lt. Khaalis further advised that, based upon the agreement reached between Assistant Chief Gavin and Major Minter, Ms. Ship would not be transported to the detention center but instead would be taken directly to State Court Records to resolve the warrant through the re-docketing process. The arrest paper work was no longer necessary since the warrant would be resolved upon completion of the re-docketing process.

Ms. Ship was transported to the courthouse by Major Young and Lt. Khaalis.

I aired on the radio that Mrs. Ship was no longer under arrest.

My body-worn camera was activated during this incident.
